#### **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

For all the awards announced nominees:

- 1. Must be affiliated with a member organisation and meet the defined criteria
- 2. Must be actively involved in the member institution
- 3. Submission must be based on current contribution to the member institution
- 4. Application must be supported by the Head of School/Department or CAPHIA representative
- 5. Only one submission will be accepted per category from each member institution

- Will be invited to present work related to their submission to the CAPHIA network, increasing their national and international profile
- Will recieve a scholarship for the CAPHIA 2023 Teaching and Learning Forum

## CAPHIA Medal



#### MEDAL DESCRIPTION

This medal recognises the exemplary achievement of an individual who has significantly contributed to Public Health Education in Australasia. The individual may or may not be in the more traditional public health space (for example outside a University) but have demonstrated a history of driving improvements, innovations and capability building to advance public health education over their career. The CAPHIA Medal is to celebrate the diversity and long-term strategic thinking of our Public Health Leaders, which reflect the practice itself.

#### NOMINATION TYPE

This award is by nomination only. Each nominee must provide their name, email, contact details and relationship with the nominee.

#### SUBMISSION DOCUMENTATION

- Position statement (250 words)
- References (2x pages)
- Written statement (750 words)
- Nominee details

#### POSITION STATEMENT (250 WORDS)

This section should be tailored to the specific submission type:

• A description of your roles and long term commitment to public health teaching excellence and leadership in the field.

#### REFERENCES

This award requires two one page written references

- 1. Internal reference from their organisation ie. Dean, Head of School, Department manager etc.
- 2. External reference that shows impact national or international level

These references endorse the submission.

## CRITERIA FOR WRITTEN STATEMENT (750 WORDS)

A clearly articulated vision and demonstration of strategic leadership Evidence may include:

- Demonstration of impact on educational course development and delivery
- A well articulated leadership style

Facilitation and empowering a community of practice

Evidence may include:

- Supporting educators through professional development
- Mentoring of public health educators

Educational leadership that facilitate student outcomes

Evidence may include:

- Longitudinal course evaluations
- Supporting inclusion, diversity and students as partners
- Supporting student engagement with public health outside of the course

Demonstration of command of the field of public education at a national level Evidence may include:

- Example of embedding a key <u>CAPHIA competency</u> into the curricula
- Dissemination of practice via conferences, presentations and or publications.

## Scholarship-Informed Teaching & Learning

#### AWARD DESCRIPTION

The Scholar-Informed Teaching & Learning (SITL) award recognises the development and implementation of teaching practice that is grounded in the scholarship of teaching and learning as applied to public health.

## CRITERIA FOR WRITTEN STATEMENT (750 WORDS)

A clearly articulated philosophy to teaching which aligns with their teaching practice Evidence may include:

- Description of of a specific SITL framework
- Reflection of why this framework speaks to your teaching style

Designed and or implemented scholarship informed approaches to teaching and learning

Evidence may include:

- Description of assessment strategies and impact
- Programmatic design applied to public health
- Implementation of evidence-based approaches to curriculum development

Dissemination and demonstration of impact

Evidence may include:

- Achievement of student achievements of <u>CAPHIA competencies</u>
- Demonstration of evaluation strategies (eg. outcome measurement)
- Dissemination of good practice i.e. presenting at the CAPHIA T&L forum, peer-reviewed publication.

#### REFERENCE

- A half-page reference by the Head of School, Department, Discipline lead or Course Director.

# Teaching Innovation



#### AWARD DESCRIPTION

CAPHIA Teaching Innovation aims to recognise creative and unique methodologies of the programs that generate impacts from the perspective of various stakeholders. While technologicals solutions may help deliver innovative practice, use of technology in and of itself will not be considered innovative. This award recognises the development and implementation of innovations that impact on learning, teaching or assessment to enable, motivate, support, and inspire students to learn. This award is to recognise innovators who make a change to the program and evaluate the outcome recognising that innovation isn't always successful.

- Description of assessment strategies and impact
- Programmatic design applied to public health
- Implementation of evidence-based approaches to curriculum development

Evaluation of practice that demonstrates improvements in students outcomes Evidence may include:

- Demonstration of evaluation strategies
- Peer review or other external feedback
- Dissemination of good practice ie. presenting at the CAPHIA Teaching & Learning Forum.

- For ECA submissions please provide evidence that meets the category requirements ie. ECA is defined as up to 5 years of teaching experience accounting for interruptions. This excludes research supervision. Please describe your teaching role and experience.
- For individual applicants please describe your current teaching position.
- For team submissions please provide a descriptor of the each applicant's contribution to the role

## CRITERIA FOR WRITTEN STATEMENT (750 WORDS)

Fostering learning that engages, supports, guides and inspires students to learn Evidence may include:

- Description of the learning environment
- Encouraging student engagement
- Supporting and facilitating student needs

Development of curricula, resources or services that reflect a command of the field Evidence may include:

- Description of assessment strategies and impact
- Programmatic design applied to public health
- Implementation of evidence-based approaches to curriculum development

Teaching practice supports students' achievement of <u>CAPHIA Foundation</u> <u>Competencies for Public Health Graduates</u>.

Evidence may include:

Identifying and describing key competencies applied

Evaluation of practice that demonstrates improvements in students outcomes Evidence may include:

- Demonstration of evaluation strategies
- Peer review or other external feedback
- Dissemination of good practice ie. presenting at the CAPHIA Teaching & Learning forum
