ABOUT THE THEME

Domestic violence is, by definition, a public health issue. Domestic violence stems from complex causes that span across disciplines and levels of health. For public health students, understanding domestic violence against public health frameworks is essential to create solutions for change.

- Design thinking enables teams to examine a problem in new ways through creative, iterative processes.
- Students are guided by both public health and domestic violence experts, and design thinking mentors.
